Richard T. Borkowski

Polish Legion of American Veterans, General Casimir Pulaski Post #30

Richard Borkowski was born July 20th, 1931. The youngest of eight children. Richard's early years were spent on Classen Avenue in the old Duck Town, a fine Polish neighborhood in Cleveland, Ohio where he attended Holy Name Grade School. He then went on to Holy Name High School, graduating in June of 1949. After graduation Richard went to work for the Standard Oil Company of Ohio.

In August of 1949 he entered the U.S. Army, after boot camp he was assigned to the 7th Infantry Division where he advanced to the rank of Staff Sergeant. His combat citations include the Combat Infantry Medal, Korean Service Medal with 5 Bronze Service Stars, United Nations Service Medal, Korean Unit Presidential Citation and the Good conduct Medal. Upon return from the service he went back to work at Standard Oil Company of Ohio and spent a total of 27 years with the company.

Richard became a member of General Casimir Pulaski Post #30 of the Polish Legion of American Veterans (PLAV) in 1960. He has been instrumental in starting the Rifle Squad which is still active today. The rifle squad has been performing duties from Final Honors for Deceased PLAV Members to Final Honors at the Western Reserve National Cemetery for fellow veterans outside of the PLAV, who choose to be buried there. The rifle squad has also marched in many Memorial and Civic observances thru the many years of its existence and has put the PLAV in the forefront of Polonia and the Public.

Richard has held many offices within the PLAV including 4 years on the Post level as Post Commander, and to this day he still serves as a Director. Richard also has been active on the Department of Ohio level stepping up thru the chairs and then finally serving 2 years as Department of Ohio, State Commander.

Of his many volunteer activities, one quite notable of Richard's achievements is his dedication to his fellow veterans that have been injured or are sick. Richard presently serves as a Deputy Representative to the Cleveland Medical Center (formerly the Wade Park Medical Center) where he has in excess of 4,900 Volunteer Hours.

Richard was also honored by the Greater Cleveland Veterans Council in 1998 and in 2007, he was honored by the Polonia Foundation for his efforts upholding the rich Polish heritage, tradition and family values.

Richard is a Life Member of the Korean War Veterans Association, Polish Legion of American Veterans, Veterans of Foreign Wars, American Legion, and the Parma Veterans Center. He also serves as a Director of the Brooklyn Polish American Home and a Delegate to the Polish American Congress.

Richard and his wife Evelyn reside in Parma, Ohio they have been a team for many years always ready to help when called upon, they have a daughter Gail and a Stepson Karl.

Charles H. Kiessling, Sr.

Charles Kiessling was born the fourth child of Martha and Oscar Kiessling at Cleveland's Lutheran Hospital. Mother was daughter to the Pastor of Salem Lutheran Church in Gretna, LA. Father was a German Merchant Seaman, who jumped ship in New Orleans when he met Martha. They got married and left Louisiana in the late 1920's for Cleveland to be near more German speaking people. His siblings include his late brother Ernst (an Air force vet), sister Annabelle and brother Ronald (a Marine vet).

Charles attended Lutheran grade schools on Cleveland's west side and graduated from Luther Memorial School. He graduated from John Marshall High School in January of 1954, enlisted in the Marine Corps that February and went to boot training at Parris Island Marine Base in South Carolina. Charles completed advanced infantry training at Camp Geiger in North Carolina and returned to Parris Island for Military Police Duty.

He was then transferred to Camp Pendleton Calif. for overseas assignment. There he volunteered for Military Police Duty with the Securities Forces Far East FMF, Pacific. He was assigned to Sangley Point Naval Station, Phillipines, for one year and then to Sasebo Naval Station, Japan for the second year. Charles returned stateside in late 1956 was discharged in February of 1957 from the Great Lakes Naval Station, Illinois. He was awarded National Defense Service Medal and the Good Conduct Medal.

After discharge, Charles was hired by the Cleveland Transit System as a Trackless Trolley Operator at Denison Station (Denison & Ridge Road) Cleveland. After Trackless Trolleys were removed from service in 1959, he then transferred to Triskett Garage to be a Bus and Rail Operator. In 1970 Charles' Superintendent recommended him for the Schedule Department by it was short lived because of a layoff in 1971 and he returned to Triskett Garage. Charles returned to the Schedule Department in 1974, there he held many positions and was appointed Director of Schedules in 1987 and he retired from the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority in August 1991. He attended management courses at Baldwin Wallace College and the University of Wisconsin/ Milwaukee.

Following his retirement, in April of 1993, Charles started working part time at the Suburban Clock and Repair in Berea, Ohio in various capacities, including sales, repair, shipping and receiving. He also did computer work and data entry for the Sales and Repair Departments.

Charles married in 1957, moved into Brook Park, and raised sons Charles Jr. (a Marine Vet) and Robert. In 1999 he moved to Columbia Park, a manufactured home Senior Community. Son Charles Jr. married and raised three children, Chuck III, a Air Force vet., Jeanette and Theodore, (active duty - Marine Corps). A family with three generations of service to our country.

Charles has been a member of the Marine Corps League since 1956 when he was signed up by his brother as a Charter Member of the Cleveland Detachment (later merged with the Major S. J. Logan Detachment) and held many offices in the detachment. He also served at the Department of Ohio as Commandant and now serves as the Department Paymaster. While at the Department he was on the committee that started the Dept. of Ohio, MCL Youth Fitness Program in 1960, which won an award from the Freedoms Foundation. He was the coordinator for the meets that were held in Cleveland and Columbus then moved to Ohio Wesleyan University in Delaware until it was discontinued in 2004 due to lack of participation by the schools. Major General Walter Churchill Sr, from Toledo was the Ohio Dept. member took the program to our national organization where it continues to have meets in San Diego, California.

Charles also serves as treasurer of the Memorial Day Association of Greater Cleveland.

We wish Charles success in leading the JVCOCC in service to veterans, their families, our men and women in uniform, our country and communities as well as supporting his family and the Marine Corps League.

LIBERTY VETERANS HONOR GARDEN - Establish a garden to honor all of our nation's defenders who gave their lives not only in the defense of our country but also to bring freedom to many nations around the world. It is appropriate to establish the garden among Cleveland's Cultural Gardens since the people of many of the nations represented in the Cleveland Cultural Garden chain now enjoy their freedom due to the ultimate sacrifice of those to be honored here. It is also to be an expression of gratitude to their families, those who served with them and their families. This site will let our current defenders and their families know that their sacrifice will not be forgotten.

The garden address is 710 Martin Luther King Jr. Drive, and located near the Northernmost and West point of the Cleveland Cultural Garden Chain with a prominent view as well as an ample area to honor past and future generations of our nation's defenders and hold ceremonies in remembrance of their sacrifice and service. A tree will be planted in the garden for each century in which our nation has lost its sons and daughters in battle, starting with the Revolutionary War. There will be four trees initially planted, one for each of the 18th, 19th, 20th and 21st centuries. A unique monument, near each of the century trees, will depict for the viewer the significance of the events that moved veterans and citizens to memorialize the sacrifice of those who gave their all. Theirs was the ultimate contribution to culture.

Our allies will be honored and remembered with a tree planted in the Liberty Veterans Memorial Garden for all who gave their lives while fighting alongside us on our soil and throughout the world. A monument will identify the defining events and present to the viewer their contributions.

A center monument of unique and significant design will be installed to express the citizens and veterans gratitude to our nations defenders and their families. It will allow future generations to continue to honor those who serve and help them never to forget those who came before them.

A separate stone with a plaque or a monument will introduce the visitor to this site and the WWI Veterans Liberty Row Memorials along Martin Luther King Jr. Drive (in 1919 dedicated as Liberty Boulevard in memory of those who died during WWI). We are also committed to restoring the trees and markers for the soldiers lost during WWI, it will follow the establishment of the garden.
